BUILDING DEPARTMENT REPORT: There were 51 permits issued for the month of September there were 21 building permits, (eight units in Plum Grove) 7 electrical, 12 mechanical and 11 plumbing, one reinspection fee for a total fee of \$10,974.00.

BLIGHT: 1 blight report on N Custer for high weeds, a letter has been sent.

Supervisor Blanchette read a Marijuana Ordinance/Zoning Proposal submitted by Jason and Amy Miller, owners of the 8710 N Custer rd. Property. There was a lengthy discussion about the proposal, and Ideas discussed. Clerk Fetterly was going to look into the rules on getting it on the ballot. There were no changes or discissions made that night.

There were a number of Township residents that talked on behalf of the Large Solar farms, all of them against Solar farms in Raisinville Township. The Planning commission will be reviewing its current ordinance.

MOTION BY Trustee Jaworski, **SUPPORTED BY** Clerk Fetterly to approve a resolution establishing a moratorium on large scale solar farms energy systems or solar farms applications for a term of 9 months, adopted October 5th, 2021. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Dundee School Superintendent gave a presentation and explained the proposal on the upcoming November 2nd ballot. He stated that it was not an increase, it was a renewal, he left a nice brochure explaining it here at the Township Hall for anyone who is interested.

Sherriff Troy Goodnough gave a presentation on how things were going at the police department. The complaints (calls) were up from last year as a whole from 128 to 135, but in a lot of the divided-out departments calls went down. The Board gave Sherriff Goodnough compliments on how well he and the police department are doing and we are liking the changes that are being made.
